



CHECKLIST

Winter camping



BEFORE THE TRIP

Make sure you have enough provisions! Two full gas cylinders are just enough for a long weekend in freezing minus temperatures, but no more. Otherwise, find a campsite with the appropriate infrastructure and gas supply.

IMPORTANT

HEAT PROBERLY

- First start the heating, then close the boiler drain valve after 30 minutes (otherwise, the frost protection switch will not stop when the valve is cold)
- When heating up, open the doors and flaps of the cupboards to distribute the heat evenly (advantage: clothes are heated at the same time)
- Keep warm air vents free
- Air the room several times a day (to prevent humidity and heat loss)
- Leave the heating in operation when leaving the vehicle
- Higher power consumption as more sources are used (info)

SNOW AND ICE

- Fit the fireplace sign at the exhaust fireplace on the side wall (dripping water, no ice formation directly on the vehicle)
- In case of snowfall: remove snow from the roof before driving on
- Switch on floor heating system (if installed in the vehicle; it only works with a 230 V external connection)
- After the warm-up phase, lay out the carpet (if it is available)
- Always keep the fresh water tank 2/3 full (never empty it to the minimum level, as this prevents the water from freezing when the vehicle is in motion)
- If necessary, leave the waste water tank open so that the waste water can drain off directly (use a bucket to collect the waste water, otherwise there is a risk of ice forming in the roller tank)

CLOSE-DOWN

When the vehicle is then decommissioned, drain all water and pipes:

- Empty freshwater tank
- Empty wastewater tank
- Empty holding tank
- Empty the heating boiler
- Drain water pipes and toilet flushes
- Leave the taps open; Attention: Switch off the 12 V supply!
